Introduction

Purpose of the Ārohia Innovation Trailblazer Grant

The Ārohia Innovation Trailblazer Grant is designed to provide funding for activities (excluding R&D) involved in taking to market a world-leading innovation that can help transform Aotearoa New Zealand's innovation ecosystem. It comprises two grants - the Ārohia Seed Grant and the Ārohia Full Grant.

Purpose of this document

This document provides guidance on what are eligible activities and costs for the Ārohia Seed Grant. Eligible Activities described in this document mean "Eligible Non-R&D Expenditure" as defined in the Ministerial Direction. The Ārohia Seed Grant funds 50% of eligible costs up to maximum of \$25k.

The activities and costs related to your grant application should be entered into the Ārohia Seed Grant Work Plan template, to outline how grant funding will be used. An <u>example of a Work Plan</u> is provided on our website. When you are ready to complete your own Work Plan, a Work Plan template can be downloaded from the grant application in the online (IMS) portal. The completed Work Plan should be submitted as part of the Ārohia Seed Grant application.

Ārohia Seed Grant applicants should review the <u>Ārohia Full Grant application questions</u> to help identify activities that can be included in an Ārohia Seed Grant Work Plan.

High level detail:

The **Ārohia Seed Grant** helps fund activities that enable you to obtain evidence needed to complete a future Ārohia Full Grant application. The evidence could relate to your innovation's potential in the following areas, all of which are assessed for the Ārohia Full Grant:

- market impact
- commercial feasibility
- commercial viability
- novelty
- benefits to the innovation ecosystem.

R&D activities are explicitly excluded from the Ārohia Innovation Trailblazer Grant. R&D activities are defined as:

- an activity that seeks to resolve a scientific or technological uncertainty as defined in the <u>Research & Development Tax Incentive</u> (RDTI), and
- any supporting activity that is integral to resolving this uncertainty.

Innovation activities that aren't integral to resolving a scientific or technological uncertainty are ineligible for New to R&D Grant and RDTI funding, but are generally covered under the Ārohia Innovation Trailblazer Grant.



Ārohia Seed Grant Eligible Activities

Evidence of market impact, commercial feasibility and commercial viability

Eligible activities to obtain evidence on market impact, commercial feasibility and commercial viability could include the following activities (note - this list is a guide and is not intended to be exhaustive):

ITEM	ELIGIBLE ACTIVITY EXAMPLES
Conduct research into customers	This could include any research to obtain evidence that a market of customers who will buy and/or use the innovation exists and can be targeted.
Conduct research into market factors	 This could include research to determine: market size market share market growth market dynamics (e.g. forces affecting market demand and supply) value chain structure market competitiveness relative to any existing offerings in the market that the innovation may compete with, or any similar innovations that are close to market or in development.
Proof-of-concept testing with stakeholders	 This could include: obtaining advice from a competent professional on any aspect of an innovation concept's feasibility and viability that is unrelated to resolving a scientific or technical uncertainty, including advice on: building a prototype non-R&D experiment design analysing test findings. building a prototype i.e. a pre-commercial mock-up, model, wireframe or sample created only for the purpose of learning (not sale), including: engaging a designer/developer purchasing equipment used to build prototypes purchasing hardware/software licences e.g. prototyping tools, co-creation platforms and data for early model development purchasing materials/components to build mock-ups/models.



ITEM	ELIGIBLE ACTIVITY EXAMPLES	
Obtain professional advice and services	You can obtain a wide range of professional/technical advice and services (non-R&D related) to help you determine if your innovation has potential market impact and represents a commercially feasible and viable opportunity. The advice/services sought could include:

	completing a market feasibility study	
	 designing/evaluating a business model, including the cost structure, pricing and revenue model aspects 	
	designing/evaluating a service delivery model concept	
	 designing/evaluating a go-to-market/distribution strategy

Purchase published reports and data	This could include subscribing to a reputable database and purchasing publications for market, solution, competitor and business model insights. The maximum subscription term we will support is one year.	
Attend an industry event	This could include attending any relevant event, such as a trade show or conference, to obtain evidence on market impact, commercial feasibility or commercial viability of your innovation.	

Evidence of novelty

Eligible activities to obtain evidence on novelty could include the following activities (note - this list is a guide and is not intended to be exhaustive):

ITEM	ELIGIBLE ACTIVITY EXAMPLES
Obtain professional advice and services	 The advice/service sought on novelty could include: engaging an expert to investigate the novelty of an innovation and discuss the terms of any intellectual property. obtaining a Freedom to Operate (FTO) opinion from a registered patent attorney and conducting a Trademark, Patent and FTO search*.
Protect Intellectual Property	This could include filing a provisional patent (to the extent it is essential to conducting research to build evidence of your innovation's potential with customers and stakeholders).
Purchase published reports and data	This could include obtaining publications on the latest developments in specific industries, academic journals, conference proceedings and accessing data repositories.

*Please note that Callaghan Innovation will only co-fund or fund patent work and patent advice that is provided by a registered patent attorney. This includes advice on the validity of patents and their infringement resulting from FTO/IP scanning search results. We recommend doing due diligence on providers in this space, including taking into account whether they are registered or recognised by any industry body. For patent related work and advice, we recommend contacting a registered Trans-Tasman patent attorney (the directory can be found <u>here</u>).

Evidence of benefits to the Aotearoa New Zealand innovation ecosystem

An innovation ecosystem is a network of organisations, individuals, and resources that are involved in the creation, diffusion, and adoption of new innovations and technologies, and that work together to create an environment that supports the development of new innovation. Resources can be financial resources, knowledge, expertise, facilities, or resources that facilitate access to new markets.

Eligible activities to obtain evidence on potential benefits to the innovation ecosystem in Aotearoa New Zealand could include the following activities (note - this list is a guide and is not intended to be exhaustive):



ITEM	ELIGIBLE ACTIVITY EXAMPLES
Conduct research into potential innovation ecosystem benefits	This could include research or discussions with any stakeholder who may be impacted by an innovation or could collaborate with you on it e.g. suppliers, iwi, industry associations, startup incubators, investors, research institutions and other entrepreneurs, to understand potential impacts and opportunities.
Purchase published reports and data	This could include purchasing research studies to understand innovation ecosystem impacts.

Ārohia Seed Grant Limited Activities / Costs

The following activities are eligible to obtain evidence on market impact, commercial feasibility, commercial viability, novelty or innovation ecosystem benefits, subject to the limits indicated:

ITEM	LIMITED ACTIVITIES / COSTS All costs referenced below are exclusive of GST
Travel to international or domestic locations	Travel could be, for example, to visit markets / customers / competitors / suppliers / distributors / partners.
	We will only contribute towards transport and accommodation (room) costs, and these must be essential for the progression of the innovation project.
	The maximum amount of approved eligible costs for travel that we will contribute towards is \$15,000 and our maximum contribution is \$7,500.
Internal labour - wages and salaries	Paying employees wages and salaries is eligible under Ārohia Seed Grant provided the employees' work is directly related to, required for, and integral to the evidence gathering activities specified in your Ārohia Seed Grant Work Plan. The eligible hourly rate for staff comprises the total of:
	 salary and wage costs, and overheads (calculated at 20% of the hourly rate).
	For salaried employees , divide the PAYE yearly contracted salary by 1,752 hours (this is the maximum number of chargeable hours per year, allowing for statutory holidays, annual leave and sick leave).
	For waged employees, use the employee's hourly rate.
	Note: You must be able to verify any internal labour costs, i.e. you need to keep records (such as pay slips or invoices) showing how much you paid to employees and when. You must retain this evidence and be able to provide it if you are audited. Internal labour costs not able to be verified will not be eligible for reimbursement.



ITEM	LIMITED ACTIVITIES / COSTS
	All costs referenced below are exclusive of GST
Internal labour - owner or shareholder labour	 The cost of paying owner or shareholder labour is eligible. For individuals with a shareholding of 5% or greater, the hourly rate is limited to the lesser of: up to \$80 per hour plus overheads, or the current direct/actual shareholder payments. Note: You must be able to verify any labour costs, i.e. you need to keep records (such as pay slips or invoices) showing how much was paid. You must retain this evidence and be able to provide it if you are audited. Labour costs not able to be verified will not be eligible for reimbursement.
Overheads	Overheads are the indirect costs or fixed expenses of operating a business. Overheads can be claimed at the fixed rate of 20% of internal labour costs to take into account the following indirect costs or fixed expenses of operating a business: insurance rates utilities, e.g. power, water and heating office rent (local and international) office cleaning security repairs and maintenance phone, postage, printing and stationery non-R&D related lease payments unrelated to your innovation project.
External Labour	 The cost of paying external labour is eligible, with external labour defined as: non-PAYE labour or contractors who invoice for their time, or internal team members who are not PAYE employees. Note: You must be able to verify any external labour costs, i.e. you need to keep records (such as pay slips or invoices) showing how much was paid. You must retain this evidence and be able to provide it if you are audited. Labour costs not able to be verified will not be eligible for reimbursement.
Database subscription	The maximum subscription term we will support is one year.
Pitch Preparation	Pitch preparation could include pitch deck creation and pitch coaching. The maximum amount of approved eligible costs for pitch preparation that we will contribute towards is \$10,000, and our maximum contribution is \$5,000.

Ārohia Seed Grant Ineligible Activities

The following activities are not eligible for Ārohia Seed Grant funding:

ITEM	INELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES
Research and Development (R&D)	The following activities are considered R&D activity and are not eligible under Ārohia Seed Grant funding:
related activities	 developing/building a prototype to test a scientific or technological uncertainty
	 engaging a technical expert to resolve a scientific or technological uncertainty related to the innovation's novelty.
	If you do need to develop a technical prototype or engage a technical expert to explore a scientific or technological uncertainty, you should consider applying for the New to R&D Grant or the RDTI.
Costs incurred outside Funding Agreement period	An activity is ineligible if it is carried out prior to the start date or after the end date of a Callaghan Innovation Ārohia Seed Grant Funding Agreement.
Expand beyond a first market launch	An activity is ineligible if:
mot market launch	 your innovation has already launched in a first market, and
	 the activity relates to expanding the innovation's reach into a new market (domestic or international).
Entertainment	Entertainment is an ineligible expense.
Protect Intellectual Property	Fees to file a full patent i.e. beyond the provisional 'patent pending' stage are ineligible (filing a provisional patent is eligible - see 'Evidence of novelty' <u>above</u>).
Professional advice	The following advice/services are ineligible under Ārohia Seed Grant funding:
and services	general legal/compliance advice (unrelated to your innovation project)
	 paying an independent auditor or accountant to prepare financial reports
	 paying someone to prepare an Ārohia Seed Grant application.
Activities that would impact reputation	An activity is ineligible if it would bring the reputation of the grant initiative, Callaghan Innovation, or the Government into disrepute.
